School counselors are certified/licensed educators who improve student success for ALL students by implementing a comprehensive school counseling program



SCHOOL COUNSELOR'S ROLE

School counselors are vital members of the education team and maximize student success

Help all students:

- apply academic achievement strategies
- manage emotions and apply interpersonal skills
- plan for postsecondary options (higher education, military, work force)

Appropriate duties include providing:

- individual student academic planning and goal setting
- school counseling classroom lessons based on student success standards
- short-term counseling to students
- referrals for long-term support
- collaboration with families/teachers/ administrators/community for student success
- advocacy for students at individual education plan meetings and other student-focused meetings
- data analysis to identify student issues, needs and challenges



SCHOOL COUNSELOR QUALIFICATIONS

- Hold, at minimum, a master's degree in school counseling
- Meet the state certification/ licensure standards
- Fulfill continuing education requirements
- Uphold ASCA ethical and professional standards




